Science: Classifying and grouping materials

Can they describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials?

Can they compare and group together a variety of materials based on their simple physical properties?

Challenge:

Can they describe the properties of different materials using words like transparent or opaque, flexible, etc.?

Can they sort materials into groups and say why they have sorted them in that way?

Can they say which materials are natural and which are man made?

Maths

- Read and write numbers to 100 in numbers and words. E.g 23 = twenty three
- Count on and back in 1s from any one or two-digit number forwards and backwards. E.g 23,24,25,26 or 37,36,35,34
- Count on and back in multiples of 2, 5 and 10. E .g 2,4,6,8,12. Or 5,10,15,20, 25 Or 10, 20, 30, 40
- Order a set of random numbers to 100.

Mental Maths:

- Recall addition and subtraction facts for each number up to 20. E.g 12 + 8 = 20 10 + 10 = 20 11 + 9 = 20
- Recall doubles of simple 2-digit numbers E.g 23 + 23. Add the tens then the ones mentally.

- Retell a story about the life of the Prophet Muhammed
- Recognise some objects used by Muslims and discuss why are they important

- Can they decide where the best place to be is during a game?

- Can they create music in response to different starting
- points?
- Can they choose sounds which create an effect?
- Can they use symbols to represent sounds?
