What is the Sport Premium?

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Alma Park have received £9850 in the academic year 2013/14.

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Accountability

From September 2013, schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

One year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure of additional funding and its impact. Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum,

so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

How are we using the funding to benefit our children?

At Alma Park we have allocated the funding in a number of ways

- hiring qualified sports coaches to provide support to teachers to boost standards of PE in all aspects
 - Professional development opportunities for all staff
 - Providing cover to release staff for professional development in PE and sport
 - Continuing to run sports activities in school and increasing pupils' participation
 - Providing places for targeted pupils on after school sports clubs
 - Pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools to develop inter school competitions and support for PE leaders
 - Continuing to provide a range of sporting activities at lunchtime to increase pupils participation in sports (sports coaches) and training of lunchtime organisers
 - Developing young sports leaders through the play leaders programme at lunchtime (PALS)
- Providing solid ICT opportunities in PE for children and staff (planning and assessment)
