Reporting Procedures

If they feel that this has not been resolved adequately, they can inform one of the AHTs or indeed the Headteacher who is available on the playground before school every morning. If your child reports an incident to you, please check that (s)he has informed his/her class teacher. If you would like to meet with your child's teacher, please arrange to meet at a mutually acceptable time. If after this you are not happy that the situation has been resolved satisfactorily, please make an appointment to meet with the Headteacher. If you feel that you would like to make a complaint, please complete a complaints form which can be downloaded from the website.
